Northcross Intermediate takes great pride in offering a two year programme that provides a range of opportunities to enable our students to develop the skills so vitally important in becoming lifelong learners.

At Northcross, our students, through mathematics, will learn to develop the ability to think creatively, critically, strategically and logically. LITERACY

As a school, nurturing strong reading, writing, and communication skills is a priority for all students. Our comprehensive approach combines proven teaching strategies, personalised instruction, and a love for literacy. With a focus on differentiation, our highly qualified teachers plan programmes to meet each student's unique needs, ensuring progress at their own pace. Through a rich literary environment and a strong home-school partnership, we empower students to become confident communicators and critical thinkers.

SCIENCE

Through hands-on experiments, inquiry-based learning, and real-world applications, our teachers ignite a passion for the nature of science and develop critical thinking skills in our students. We want our students to be curious and able to identify problems, ask questions, gather information, find solutions, test claims, make predictions and to realise that often there is more than one solution. We want them to 'experience' Science, not just 'learn' about it.

SOCIAL SCIENCES

Through inquiry-based learning, critical thinking, and active engagement, our teachers foster a deep understanding of society, culture, and history, including Aotearoa New Zealand Histories. By exploring diverse perspectives, global issues, and civic responsibility, we inspire empathy, tolerance, and a sense of social responsibility in our students.

TE AO MĀORI

Te ao Māori involves learning about the language, culture and world view of Māori. Te Reo Māori and tikanga Māori are integrated into daily activities allowing students to develop a deeper understanding of New Zealand's unique bi-cultural heritage. Through engaging lessons, songs, and interactive activities, we foster cultural appreciation, respect, and a sense of pride.

LANGUAGES

In helping prepare our students for the future we believe it is important to learn a language other than English. Selected languages are offered after school, these may include Chinese/Mandarin, French and Spanish. Our students are offered the opportunity to study their chosen language and culture in a small group and are taught by qualified tutors.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

Learning with digital technologies is a key component that is integrated into all Northcross classrooms to promote creativity, collaboration, and higher order thinking through innovative and authentic learning opportunities. Through purposeful design and development of digital outcomes and learning about computational thinking, students gain the knowledge and skills they need to be responsible digital citizens and users of digital technologies across the curriculum.

OUTDOOR EDUCATION

Education Outside the Classroom is an important aspect of our Health and Physical Education programme.

It provides experiences and opportunities to become active and safe in the outdoors, promoting skills such as team work, communication, trust, problem solving, leadership and responsibility. During March, all Year 7 students have the opportunity to participate in outdoor educational programmes around and outside the school. The cost for this is around \$220. Over 2 weeks in March, all Year 8 students will have the opportunity to attend our Finlay Park Camp. This cost is likely to be around \$420.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

eLearning is a key component in all Northcross classrooms and digital technologies are integrated appropriately to support authentic, higher order and collaborative learning. This learning focuses on developing students' capability to create digital technologies for a specific purpose. Students develop the knowledge and skills they need as digital citizens and users of digital technologies across the curriculum.

PB4L (POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING)

Our school-wide Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) approach focuses on building and maintaining positive, respectful relationships across the school community. PB4L offers all of our school staff best-practice tools and techniques to maintain and restore relationships. REPORTING TO PARENTS

This is an important part of the school's activities. On the first day we have our Parent / Teacher / Student individual interviews – this is an introduction to the year. There are currently two other interviews with Parents / Guardians / Caregivers / Whānau: an interview towards the end of Term 1 for goal setting and sharing of data and then the Teacher, Parent, Caregiver and Student mid-year interview after reports have been issued (see Student assessment page for more details). These interviews are part of our student led conferences and focus on the recent mid-year progress and the goals for the next half year. The student is a vital part of this programme with their input being part of the process of students starting to guide and control their own learning.

NORTHCROSS LIBRARY

Northcross Library is the heart of the school. It is a popular, safe and welcoming place that strives to include all students while valuing and celebrating diversity.

We're open from 8:30am to 3:30pm every school day. With lots of big windows, comfortable furniture and an in-ground fishpond (with a waterfall!), the library is highly valued and well-used. Students use the peaceful space during morning tea and lunchtimes to relax, read quietly and reconnect with friends.

The library is well stocked with a large print collection that has been selected to inspire a love of reading and support students' learning needs. The collection includes a wide range of fiction, non-fiction and graphic novels. New titles are regularly added, keeping the collection fresh and relevant to the interests and needs of our readers. Students borrow books for three weeks, and we have an online library app that students can use to manage their loans and reserve books that are then delivered to their classrooms.

Our full-time, fully qualified librarian is a registered member of the Library and Information Association of New Zealand Aotearoa (LIANZA). She is passionate about reading and helping students find books that appeal to their unique preferences and needs. A friendly team of student librarians assist with library duties during class visits and break times.









School Uniform

The Northcross Intermediate School uniform is a reflection of our school. The uniform should be worn complete and in a way that reflects pride on both the student and the school.

UNIFORM (UNISEX)

- NX Polo Shirt
- NX Sport Shirt
- NX Navy Shorts
- NX Navy Sweatshirt
- Black coloured sport shoes suitable laceup shoes that will support running (not skate shoes, slip on or loose lace shoes. Must be non-marking).
- Navy NX ankle socks (School design only).
- NX Cap (no other caps permitted) or NX Navy Bucket Hat are compulsory in terms one and four for all outdoor activities.
- NB: Tights are not permitted to be worn under Sports Shorts.

OPTIONAL

 NX Navy Rain Jacket (with hood) – this jacket is optional. Students can wear any weather protective jacket to and from school but it must be removed during the day while at school. However, the NX Navy Jacket may be worn during the day.

- NX Track Pants
- Sports Hoodies At various times of the year, sports hoodies are available for purchase.
 These are only for sports practice – they are not considered part of our school uniform.

All school uniform, except footwear, are purchased online from Argyle at www.argyleonline.co.nz

PLEASE NOTE:

- All uniform and personal items brought to school should be named. No responsibility is accepted for loss or damage of items.
- Watches that do not connect to mobile phones are permitted.
- One pair of plain, small gold or silver studs (no coloured stones) or small plain keepers in pierced ears (only one per ear) are permitted.
 No other jewellery is to be worn.
- Hair ties and headbands are to be navy blue or white only. No coloured hair clips or other hair accessories.
- Hair can only be of a natural colour with no multi-coloured streaking or colouring.
- Cosmetics are not permitted, except for clear nail polish.
- The Board of Trustees is responsible for detailing the items comprising the school uniform. If an article of clothing can be seen it must be part of the uniform.
- Students are to be in correct school uniform at all times while at school.


NORTHCROSS ONLINE SHOP

TERM COSTS

Each term, further costs may be made for class trips and activities. We will endeavour to give reasonable notice but ask that payment is made in advance to enable the school to cover the cost of each event with the external providers. We are both hopeful and excited that these costs can gradually be reduced over time.





Digital Technologies and BYOD

The use of Digital Technology is a key component in all Northcross classrooms and our vision is that the technologies will be integrated appropriately to support authentic, higher order and collaborative learning. We encourage all students to bring a personal learning device (it should adhere to NX minimum specs—see below) to support their learning in the classroom. These will have access to the internet and the school online environment via the Northcross WiFi.

MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS FOR OWN DEVICE

A device may fall into the following categories:

- (1) Laptop (2) Chromebook (3) Notebook
- Must have at least a 10" screen
- Needs to be 5GHz WiFi capable (2.4GHz devices will not be supported)
- Keyboard can be portable but must be able to type.
- Antivirus and operating system updates installed and up to date.

We also recommend the following:

- USB port
- Headphones (earbuds)

A BYOD Evening will be held at Noel Leeming in Albany for Northcross later in the year. A range of devices will be on sale. We will notify families via email, notices to contributing schools and through the NX website.

WHAT WE HAVE FOUND

As a household your decision will be based on your child's IT knowledge and experience. Every student is unique and one operating system may be preferred to another. We are happy to give advice if required.

NOTE: From our experience we have found that devices less than 3 years old have been more suitable and reliable. Devices should not be compromised with add-ons or a multitude of games and recreational applications.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the benefits of a student having their own device?

- Personalized Learning: Students can access educational resources and tools tailored to their individual needs and learning styles. This can lead to a more engaging and effective learning experience.
- Digital Citizenship: Using devices can help students develop essential digital skills, such as critical thinking, problem-solving, and responsible online behaviour. These skills are crucial for success in today's digital world.
- Enhanced Collaboration: Devices can facilitate collaboration and teamwork among students. They can work together on projects, share ideas, and communicate effectively, fostering a more collaborative learning environment.

Can a student device be left at school?

Every class will have a lockable storage unit where, on occasion, devices can be kept overnight if required.

Will my child be expected to share their device?

No, a student's device is exclusively for their learning. If they choose to share their device it is ultimately still their responsibility.

How much time is spent on a computer/device?

This can vary from day to day. Breaks are regular as the class programme is broken into learning periods. Many traditional learning activities along with a range of digital technologies are all part of our blended classroom programme.

What are the Hardware and Software Considerations?

How can my child's computing device connect to the Internet?

Northcross Intermediate provides a wireless network which students may connect to when using their devices at school.

Are there suggested accessories?

Providing a padded bag or protective case is highly recommend. A headset will be useful. We also require devices to have a keyboard (either attached or on screen).

Will there be "charging stations" so my child's electronic device can be recharged?

Considering today's battery technology, the device's battery charge should be sufficient for lessons which require its use throughout the day. A device should be fully charged at home overnight. Students are able to use their power adapter if they have the teacher's permission.

What software will be needed on my child's computer?

No software needs to be purchased as students will have access to the school's Google G Suite cloud based learning platform. Students will be able to use the many productivity tools within G Suite (docs, sheets, slides and more) and have access to online storage.

Whose Responsibility Is It?

Who pays for the technology brought to school?

These devices will be purchased by and remain the property of the family.

Who is responsible for any repairs or updating of personal learning devices?

Students and/or their families are responsible for their personal learning devices at all times. Northcross Intermediate can arrange technical support for repair, maintenance or help to update personal learning devices – costs per service will be outlined when logging a repair job.

Who is responsible for damage, loss, or theft of devices your child brings to school?

Families must stress the responsibilities their children have when bringing their own computing devices to school. Any devices students bring to school are their sole responsibility.

Northcross Intermediate takes no responsibility to search for lost or stolen devices nor is there any assumption of financial responsibility by Northcross Intermediate for damaged, lost or stolen personal computing devices.

Will the family need to have Internet access at home?

It is recommended that families have some form of Internet access at home so a child is able to make full use of the online school resources including the multitude of resources available on the World Wide Web. We highly recommend parental controls on any home devices and access.

- Safety and Protection: Parental controls can help shield children from harmful content, such as inappropriate websites, online predators, and cyberbullying.
- Time Management: Parents can set limits on screen time, ensuring that children are not spending excessive hours online and balancing their digital activities with other important aspects of their lives.
- Academic Focus: Parental controls can help create a conducive environment for learning by limiting distractions and ensuring that children are using the internet for educational purposes.
- Privacy and Security: Parental controls can help protect children's personal information and privacy online, reducing the risk of identity theft or other security breaches.
- Values and Guidelines: Parental controls can be used to reinforce family values and guidelines, helping children develop healthy digital habits and behaviours.

Does Northcross suggest any other considerations?

We strongly recommend that you include a device on a family's contents insurance. If purchasing a new computing device for a child to use at school, we recommend purchasing an extended warranty.

Miscellaneous Information

Will my child need to have a signed Acceptable Use Policy on file?

Yes. In order for Northcross Intermediate to supervise student use of the computer network and the Internet, both the <u>Student Responsible Use Policy</u> and the <u>Bring Your Own Device - Acceptable Use Policy</u> forms must be signed by all students. Parents/guardians are required to read and sign the agreement. Signing the document indicates that the student and parent/guardian have read and understand the expectations of the school.

When can my child use the electronic device at school?

Students will use their learning devices in class as instructed by the teacher. It is expected that students will need to bring electronic devices every day.

Students may use their electronic devices during break periods only when permitted by school personnel, provided that the devices are being used in accordance with our Responsible Use Guidelines. Northcross does have digital free days where devices are not to be used during breaktimes.

Will my child be expected to use his or her computing device both at school and at home?

Just as with traditional assignments, some assignments may need to be completed at home.

Will students be able to print documents?

- Students will be able to access printers at school as follows:
- printing capabilities from school computers, and
- from their own device if logged onto their school Google account (nxschool.kiwi) through Google print.

All printing is logged and monitored through print costing software. Students have a \$5 quota at the beginning of the year which may require topping up at times.

Where will my child's work be stored?

Students will store their work on the school Cloud Platform (their school Google Drive account @nxschool.kiwi). In so doing, the student will have access to their work wherever they have Internet access

Mobile phones in the classroom

As per the Government Policy, all state schools and kura are required to prohibit students from accessing or using mobile phones while they are attending school. **Mobile Phones are not considered to be a personal learning device** BUT school personnel may, at times, allow students to use mobile phones in classrooms for class activities. At all other times students must adhere to the Government Policy that bans mobile phones from schools.

PLEASE NOTE:

- All students will have secure access to the NX WiFi.
 Access is monitored and delivered via the school's fast fibre connection and enterprise-class firewall.
- All students will adhere to the school's Responsible Use Policy, Digital Citizenship criteria and BYOD Mobile Contract.
- Northcross reserves the right to restrict access to the NX BYOD or to confiscate a device if a student is deemed to have broken digital protocol or Cyber Use guidelines
- In bringing a device students are ultimately responsible for that device on the way to and from school and while at school. We highly recommend having any device covered by the family's contents insurance policy. Northcross is not liable for any damage or loss to a student's device.






